

A/V (AUDIO/ VISUAL)

- **Where:** Life Teen Camp Covecrest (Tiger, GA), Life Teen Camp Hidden Lake (Dahlonega, GA), or Life Teen Camp Wild Sky (Medina, TX).
- **Who:** One individual at each Life Teen camp location will fill the A/V role as a part of the Program Team. The A/V role and Program Team are part of Service Crew, which is the crew of people who serve behind the scenes in a variety of roles all summer long to help ensure the camp creates an environment that facilitates a relationship with Christ.
- **Community / Housing:** As a part of Service Crew, the person assigned to A/V will attend all possible formation sessions and will report to the Program Coordinator for tasks and responsibilities. This person will also be housed with other Service Crew members of the same gender.
- **Key Responsibilities:** The primary role of the A/V position is to facilitate the various aspects of lighting, sound, and video throughout camp as well as to assist in facilitating the camp experience as part of the Program Team. This person coordinates with the priests, hosts, and musicians every week for any specific A/V needs for the various sessions, Masses and more. The person running A/V sets the tone, mood, and pace of summer camp by controlling the lights and sound and also assists in setting up and breaking down any equipment needed to provide sound or lighting away from the main meeting areas. Additionally, the person in the A/V role, like all Summer Missionaries, will be responsible for assisting in fundraising efforts for Life Teen to further the mission of leading teens closer to Christ. The main tasks for A/V each week include:
 - Preparing for each camp week by making sure that the meeting space is reset and ready, including checking speaker levels, adjusting spotlights, and cleaning, moving, or organizing equipment as needed;
 - Maintaining proper level and visuals of the lights, sound, and video for all sessions and Masses throughout the camp week;
 - Meeting with the host, musician, and priest prior to the first session and first Mass each week to see if there are any specific A/V needs:
 - Ensuring that the priest, host, and musician understand how to use the equipment and providing any extra equipment they may need;
 - Working with the musician to confirm lyrics on ProPresenter for all songs utilized throughout each camp week;
 - Setting up and breaking down any A/V equipment as needed for outdoor Mass or activities;
 - Being present at every session and providing additional assistance for the Program Team as needed.

- **Success Factors:** The person filling the A/V role will be familiar with using lighting, sound, and video equipment, will understand how to operate a sound board, and will have experience working in ProPresenter. A successful person in the A/V role will have excellent time management and multi-tasking skills and will also have the ability to be flexible and adapt to last minute changes, such as a change in location due to the weather. This person will be prayerful, mission-minded, and obedient and will be professional in working with the priest, host, and musician each week to humbly and obediently serve their needs. A successful person in the A/V role will be motivated to serve humbly however needed and will serve with joy while working behind-the-scenes to support all camp A/V needs.
- **Physical Demands:** This role requires long periods of computer use to support the A/V needs during sessions. This role also requires the ability to move and set up lighting, sound, and video equipment, as well as extensive work outdoors and daily movement around camp property.
